



Route

Highlights

◆ Follow the same pilgrimage route as in the Edo period to Mt. Nokogiri and experience Japanese Buddhist culture and carving techniques first-hand, including one of Japan's largest-class Great Buddhas.

◆ Visit Jogashima Park, a two-star destination in the Michelin Green Guide, and fully enjoy the magnificent scenery woven by nature.

◆ Experience the traditional "Mini Tairyō-bata" (big-catch flag) dyeing technique, preserved since the Edo period, at Mitomi Dyeing Shop, which has a storied history as a purveyor to the Shogunate.

① Ota Memorial Museum of Art
A museum specializing in Ukiyo-e art, housing approximately 15,000 works centered around the collection of the late Seizo

By Train 3 hrs **OR** By Car 70 min

② Hishikawa Moronobu Memorial Museum
A public museum opened in 1985 that introduces the world of Ukiyo-e and the life of local hero Hishikawa Moronobu, famous for his masterpiece *Beauty Looking Back*.

Staying in Kyonan

Day 2 — AM — PM —

From Kyonan

On Foot 60 min **OR** By Car 10 min

② Mt. Nokogiri Guided Walk
Follow the traditional Edo-period pilgrimage route to encounter Japan's largest-class stone Buddha, 1,500 Arhat statues, and the thrilling "Hell Peek" (Jigoku Nozoki) lookout on a sheer cliff. Learn and experience Japanese Buddhist and carving artistry.

By Car 3 min **OR** On Foot 14 min

② Kanaya Port - Tokyo Bay Ferry - Kurihama Port
A 40-minute voyage from the Boso Peninsula in Kanagawa Prefecture to Kurihama Port in Chiba Prefecture. From the boat, view the rugged rock faces of Mt. Nokogiri and the distant skyscrapers of Tokyo and Yokohama.

Staying in Misakiguchi

Day 3 — AM — PM —

From Misakiguchi

By Bus 30 min **OR** By Car 14 min

③ Jogashima Park
Listed in the Michelin Green Guide Japan with two stars, meaning "worth a detour." The park is at its best in January and February, when the double-flowered narcissus are in full bloom.

By Bus 10 min **OR** By Car 6 min

③ Mitomi Dyeing Shop
Having originally dyed banners for the Edo Shogunate, the shop later transitioned to dyeing *Tairyō-bata* (big-catch flags). Experience the "Mini Tairyō-bata" dyeing process, a tradition unchanged since the Edo period. The shop's work is selected as one of the "100 Best Specialties of Kanagawa."

By Train & On Foot 90 min **OR** By Car 60 min

④ Kumagawa-juku Post Town
One of the 53 stations of the Tokaido road. It flourished as a strategic junction where the sea and land routes met. Even today, traces of the bygone era remain in the townscape and place names.
