Stay in Kamakura

① Tokyo Mizube Cruising Line

A cruise along the Sumida River where the transit itself is the sightseeing. In spring, enjoy riverside cherry blossoms and fresh greenery while taking in the contrast between historic Edo-era views and modern Tokyo.

② Hama-rikyu Gardens

A grand garden built as a villa for the Tokugawa Shogun family. Explore the tidal pond that changes its appearance with the tide. In spring, cherry blossoms and canola flowers color the grounds where historic gardens and modern cityscapes coexist.

③ Engaku-ji Temple

Stroll through the grounds of a representative Kamakura Zen temple. Within the grounds, there remains a garden designated as a National Place of Scenic Beauty and National Treasure architecture. In spring, cherry blossoms color the grounds, and you can experience Japanese Zen culture through matcha tea.

- ◆ An elegant Daimyo garden featuring a tidal pond and seasonal flowers, beautifully incorporating modern skyscrapers as borrowed scenery—a serene oasis in the city center.
- ◆ Explore ancient paths to encounter the original landscape of Kamakura, where history and daily life breathe together.
- ◆ Clear your mind with faint fragrances and savor the depth of Japanese culture with all five senses for a quiet, luxurious moment.



③ "Kodo" (Incense Experience)

Experience the world of "Kodo", passed down with Kamakura's history. Quietly face the scent of aromatic wood and touch Japan's unique spiritual culture, sensing seasonal changes and your heart. (Available at multiple locations near Kamakura Station).



③ Mt. Kamakura

A hike starting from Kamakura Station through the "Kamakurayama" area, where ancient historic paths, nature, and local life blend together. In spring, young leaves and seasonal wildflowers add color as you walk along quiet paths to touch Kamakura's history and nature.



③ Enoshima

From Kamakurayama to the "Enoshima" area, where the history of the sea and spiritual faith live on. Enjoy views from the observatory and explore the "Iwaya" caves, long revered as sacred places of faith. Take in the open and liberating scenery unique to the island. (Approx. 12km from Kamakura Station to Enoshima).
