① Yosegi-zaiku Experience

A traditional Hakone craft developed during the Edo period. Experience creating natural wood inlay pieces.

① Old Tokaido Guide Walk

The Old Tokaido Road, where cobblestones and cedar trees remain. A walk along the highway featuring amazake teahouses dating back to the Edo period and the Imperial Gift Park.

① Lake Ashinoko

A volcanic lake surrounded by the Hakone Outer Rim Mountains. From the lakeshore, you can enjoy views of Mount Fuji and the surrounding mountain scenery.

② Enoura Observatory

An art space spreading across the hills overlooking Sagami Bay—often called “Tokyo’s closest natural heritage site”—where contemporary art, nature, and astronomy converge.

A guided walking tour starting at Nihonbashi, the origin point of Edo, featuring visits to Fukutoku Shrine, dashi tasting, knife sharpening demonstrations, and viewing the Kiyo-shōkan.
